

Microblading Info Sheet

Microblading is a semi-permanent brow enhancement service that shapes and fills the brows. **Please let us know** if any of the following apply to you:

- -Taken Accutane
- -Treated for cancer
- -Taking blood thinners
- -Difficulty healing

Before your appointment:

- -Avoid alcohol 24 hours prior
- -Avoid medications such as: Advil, ibuprofen, Aleve, Motrin, aspirin, Excedrin, etc. Tylenol is ok.
- -Do not receive laser or facial procedures 2 weeks before your brow appointment

Please be aware that your brows will appear darker than desired in the days following your appointment. Flaking/peeling may occur and this is a normal part of the healing process.

Microblading aftercare:

Apply a very small amount (the size of a grain of rice) of A&D or Aquaphor to the brows morning and night beginning that night.

You may gently and quickly wash your brows when you wash your face and immediately pat your brows dry. Other than this, the brows should be kept dry.

When washing your hair, avoid having the water run over your face. It helps to keep a dry towel handy and pat them dry if they get wet during a shower.

Avoid direct sunlight, sweating, tanning, saunas, makeup (or any other product) on the brows until brows are healed.

What to expect:

Immediately after –shape may appear uneven due to swelling

Day 1-3 eyebrows will appear darker and thicker

Day 4 –7 eyebrows will be dry and itchy. Do not scratch, rub or pick at it. They might start to scab/crack or flake off. Eyebrows will look patchy and uneven during healing process. It is absolutely normal. Please DON'T PANIC.

Day 7-10 scabs should be all gone (some can take up to 14 days)-Sometimes eyebrows will appear as if there is no color. The remaining color has absorbed under the layer of skin and in the following week it will resurface as skin cells repair.

Week 3 –4 eyebrows will appear true color. Eyebrow might still look patchy or uneven shape. Some rare cases pigment doesn't retain well.

Week 4 –6 come back for a touch up. Any small corrections can be made at this visit.
